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involved with over recent years include the PCA's participation in FIG Bilbao art fair, Spain in 2018 where we introduced Australian printmaking to a European audience. In 2019 I instigated the exhibition of the PCA Print Archive for Parliament House in Canberra titled, *Imprint: Survey of the Print Council of Australia*, and worked on the major project *The Kyoto Hanga International Print Exhibition*, at the Caloundra Regional Gallery, Queensland with demonstrations and workshops and a two-day symposium at the University of the Sunshine Coast - *A Meeting of Cultures: Japan and Australia Print Symposium 2019*.

I'm an award-winning curator and writer with 15 years experience in the tertiary art museum sector. I'm the Collections Curator at Flinders University Museum of Art – custodian of 8000 artworks, half of which includes prints, photographs, drawings, watercolours and artist books from the Renaissance to now. I'm responsible for managing the collection and associated exhibition research, development and display. I've curated, managed and published on printmaking and works on paper exhibitions including Bee-stung Lips: Barbara Hanrahan (2021), touring regional SA (2022-23); Ray Harris: Ritual Nature (2021); Patrick Pound: thinking through things (2016); and co-curated Tjina Nurna-ka, Pmarra Nurna-kanha, Itla Itla Nurna-kanha: Our Family, Our Country, Our Legacy (2019) for the Art Gallery of South Australia. FUMA's collection includes 4000 works by First Nation peoples and I'm experienced in best-practice protocols and consultation regarding the care and presentation of this work.

If elected to the PCA committee, I'll bring my expertise in prints and works on paper publishing, curation and collection management, as well as First Nations cultural competency, to assist the organisation in its goals and activities. These skills can be drawn on for PCA's primary outputs including its flagship quarterly journal IMPRINT; annual Print Commission; Biennial Print Exchange; Print Archive; PCA Gallery; and new projects. If elected, on behalf of PCA I'll advocate for the Australian printmaking community and support excellence and innovation in the field, with special emphasis on the SA sector, including its engagement with PCA. I'll also assist in raising the profile of the PCA among my national network of artists, curators and arts workers. I'm aware of the roles and

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responsibilities of committee membership. If elected, I'll abide by these guidelines, the Rules of the association, and all relevant legislation (including but not limited to the Associations Incorporation Reform Act 2012 and its associated Regulations).

I wish to express my keen interest in becoming a committee member of the Print Council of Australia representing printmaking communities in South Australia. I have been a passionate printmaker for nearly 20 years and for much of that time a member of the PCA, and avid reader of *Imprint* magazine. My time as manager at Light Square Gallery and then curator/program assistant for Arts in Health at Flinders Medical Centre expanded my connections with the wider SA arts community, including Flinders University Art Museum, ArtLab, Guildhouse, AGSA, various council art spaces, private galleries and ARIs — networks that may prove valuable for securing a venue for the annual display of the Print Commission. With my experience, my standing in the SA print community, and commitment to printmaking I believe I would make an ideal PCA committee member.
