### **Kay Watanabe**

I have been a printmaker for over 25 years. I was trained in Tokyo, London and Sydney and I am currently based in Brisbane, Queensland. I create prints, using various printmaking techniques, including etching, linocut, woodcut, mokuhanga, drypoint, collagraph, lithograph and screen printing. I also make artist books, zines and small sculptures, as well as drawing and painting. I actively exhibit my works in solo and group shows in Australia and internationally. I participate in competitions and have won numerous awards. I teach various printmaking techniques in printmaking studios, workshops in universities, art schools, community groups and art festivals. I have been a member of the management committee of Impress Printmakers Studio and Gallery in Brisbane for the last several years. As well as being a frequent studio user and a participant in exhibitions organised by the studio, I teach workshops and facilitate monthly printmaking gatherings there. Living in Brisbane since 2010, I now know many printmakers in the Brisbane area and I am expanding my networks with printmakers and printmaking groups in Queensland and beyond. I would like to contribute to promote contemporary printmaking in Australia with the help of these colleagues and groups, and by making efforts in boosting interest in printmaking media in the art industry and general public.

### **Dr Rhiannan Johnson**

My name is Dr Rhiannan Johnson, and I am an artist and educator based in Toowoomba, Queensland. I have been a practicing artist since 2007 and my work is primarily situated in the fields of contemporary printmaking, painting, and artist book practices. I have exhibited both nationally and internationally and have co-curated a range of group exhibitions and print/artwork exchange initiatives (including the *UniSQ 20x20 Print Exchange Folio* (2009-current) and the *Fill Your Eyes* postcard exchange (2023-current)). I am a Senior Lecturer in Creative Arts (Printmaking) at the University of Southern Queensland (UniSQ). In this role, I am particularly interested in supporting emerging artists and strengthening regional



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creative communities. I am an active member of the Print Council of Australia and have engaged in opportunities including writing for IMPRINT ("Objects of desire." *Imprint.* 55 (2), 2020, pp. 21-24), producing an edition of reduction linocut prints for the 2020 PCA Print Commission (*The Second Window,* 2020), and engaging with the PCA Print Exchange. I am familiar with PCA activities including the publication of the quarterly IMPRINT journal, online blog, annual print commission, print exchange, PCA gallery, exhibitions and the broader promotion and advocacy of Australian print practices. Further, I am aware and accepting of the roles and responsibilities of committee membership as outlined. While I hold full time employment in the tertiary sector and maintain an independent arts practice, I have the capacity to contribute to the goals and activities of the PCA as these are well-aligned with my current experience and expertise.

### **Robert Heather**

Robert Heather is the Executive Director of the Art Gallery Society of NSW and has been working in public galleries, museums, libraries and educational institutions for almost three decades. He has previously been the Director of the New England Regional Art Museum (NERAM) in Armidale and the Director of Advancement, Communications and Events at the University of New England. ## **Bronwyn Johnson**

Bronwyn has served on several Boards, including as President of Arts Project Australia steering it through the introduction of the NDIS. She remains on the Exhibitions and Collections Committee at Arts Project and was an Australia Council Peer from 2012-16. As CEO and Artistic Director of the notfor-profit Melbourne Art Fair from 1996-2011, Bronwyn built one of the leading visual arts events of the Asia Pacific and delivering an estimated \$52M in sales to living Australian artists. Bronwyn established the Melbourne Art Foundation (MAF) in 2003 to produce the MAF Awards for the Visual Arts held at the Art Gallery of NSW and provided, through the Foundation, grants for the independent arts sector to participate at the Melbourne Art Fair. Bronwyn devised and produced CLIMARTE's ART+CLIMATE=CHANGE festivals in 2015, 2017 and 2019 with exhibits across Melbourne and regional Victoria's public, independent and private galleries to inspire action on climate change. She co-edited two books for Melbourne University Press on these festivals most recently with Kelly Gellatly, ART+CLIMATE=CHANGE II. During 2020, Bronwyn Johnson collaborated with artist Jon Campbell and master printer Aaron Beehre of Ilam Art School, Christchurch to produce a book of risograph limited edition prints. No Planet B was exhibited at Gertrude Glasshouse for the National Gallery of Victoria's Art Book Fair and is distributed through Manic books. ### Lea Kylie Rose

I'm currently a PhD Researcher (Cultural Geography and Indigenous Knowledge Institute) Faculty of Science, University of Melbourne. I'm the first artist to be inaugurated into the Science Faculty. I have recently completed post graduate studies in Visual Arts, Victoria College of the Arts (VCA), Melbourne University with my primary art practice in printmaking. I am a multi-disciplinary artist that showcases printmaking through different contemporary practices. This month I was chosen by the World Craft Council to represent Australia in Bukhara, Uzbekistan in the Zar International Festival of which my printmaking works were exhibited following recent solo shows in Melbourne. While there as a member of PCA I highlighted Imprint magazine on Instagram and handed out many copies to prominent people internationally.

As a young person I grew up in the family business in Malvern and was trained in all aspects of business, including sponsorship and corporate donations. In the 90's after I finished my BA of Fine Arts Prahran/VCA University of Melbourne, I founded the Art Therapy program at The Royal Children's Hospital Melbourne. Sponsored by Rotary, I campaigned heavily throughout my time of employment for corporate and small business donations and sponsorship. This led to working for the Gawler Foundation, a not for profit organisation as their senior therapist where I also lectured and travelled creating sponsorship and donations. I am an internationally published author and lecturer which has given me wide global connections. I am a natural communicator, able to connect into the business sector to invest in art and support artists. My Partner works as a National Manager in corporate business in Collins St, Melbourne CBD, this allows me to have direct connection to Melbourne's business sector. I have a personal passion for protecting and supporting the longevity of


